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1. LOWER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS (or equivalents):

MATH 154/157 may substitute MATH 151 or 150 and, MATH 155/158 may substitute MATH 152, with grades of B+ or better, and permission from the School.

WQB requirements: Students are required to complete 6 units of writing (W), 6 units of Breadth Science (B-Sci), 6 units of Breadth Social Science (B-Soc), 6 units of Breadth Humanities (B-Hum) and 6 units of Undesignated Breadth (UB).

Some WQB courses may fulfill two requirements. Some courses have multiple designations. For complete WQB regulations please refer to http://www.sfu.ca/ugcr/for_students.html.

2. UPPER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS:

- Required courses Students must complete all courses listed in the required column.
- Elective courses Students must select the appropriate number of courses from each column, as indicated
- Additional courses Students must complete 4 additional units of upper division physical or human geography AND 3 additional units of upper division course work in any subject to bring their total upper division units to 45.

WQB Requirement - Students must complete their upper division W with CMPT 376-3 or GEOG 322W/389W/455W.

CGPA Requirement - Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average (CGPA) to remain in the program.

Faculty of Science Requirements: In addition to the above requirements, students must also satisfy Faculty of Science major program requirements to complete a total of 120 units including

- additional upper division units to total a minimum of 44 upper division units (excluding EDUC 401 to 406)
- students who were enrolled at Simon Fraser University between fall 1991 and summer 2006 are required to
 complete a minimum of 12 units in subjects outside the Faculty of Science (excluding EDUC 401 to 406)
 including six units minimum to be completed in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences

Faculty of Applied Sciences Requirements: At least two thirds of the total Upper Division units in the program must have been completed at Simon Fraser University. Please refer to the current SFU calendar for full details.

3. CO-OPERATIVE EDUCATION: Combines work experience with academic studies—all students are encouraged to apply. Co-op is not mandatory; however, students completing 3 co-op placements receive a certificate of completion while students completing 4 or more co-op placements receive a co-op designation on their transcript and parchment. Note: You cannot graduate on a coop term. Please contact the Coop office for full details.
