# ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

## 1. LOWER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS (or equivalents):

- WQB requirements: Students are required to complete 6 units of writing (W), 6 units of Breadth Science (B-Sci), 6 units of Breadth Social Science (B-Soc), 6 units of Breadth Humanities (B-Hum) and 6 units of Undesignated Breadth (UB).
- Some APSC courses will also automatically fulfill WQB check with an academic advisor to confirm. 3 W units must be upper division course, taken at Simon Fraser University within the student's major subject. Some WQB courses may fulfill two requirements. Some courses have multiple designations. For complete WQB regulations please refer to: <u>http://www.sfu.ca/ugcr/for\_students.html</u>.

## 2. UPPER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS:

- APSC requirements (21 units) at least 21 units must be in CMPT, ENSC, MSE and MACM coursework
- 9 additional units of APSC or Faculty of Science
- 15 additional units of upper division courses from any faculty

## **ELECTIVE COURSES**

Students will have room to take additional elective credits in order to complete 120 credits required for graduation.
